## **Terrence Powell**

### **Using the Oneway Coring System and Hollowing with the Trent Bosch Hollowing System**

Terrence started by showing how to use the Oneway Easy Core System. He said that he had looked at several options, but that the Oneway system was by far the easiest for him. He said that while the Oneway system was easy to use, it was not as flexible as some other systems. He said that you did not have much in the way of flexible shape of the bowls. He said that the set-up was fairly simple. After the set-up, he told us what blades that were available. (9", 11", 13" and 16"). Terrence had only the 9", 11", 13" blades with him. He started with the 9" knife set and cored the first bowl. He allowed enough width for shrinkage in the drying process. He next used the 11" knife set and allowed several members to try coring the bowl. Finally, he used the 13" knife set to core the third and final bowl. He also let members try the process. When finished there were three bowls where without the system, there would only be one bowl. If selling bowls, he said that the additional bowls paid for the system and not wasted wood.

Next, he set up the Trent Bosch Hollowing System. Terrence said that he looked at and tried several hollowing systems. He attended a class at the John C. Campbell Folk School with Rudy Lopez as the instructor. Rudy

had several systems and tools available for the students to try. Terrence said he was leaning towards the Jamison system, but that when he tried the Trent Bosch system, he was sold. He showed how easy the set-up was and the began hollowing. He did not bring a drill to set the depth, so he said it would be a little harder to do the hollowing around the center. He showed us the three different tools ( $\frac{3}{4}$ " ) used and also the  $\frac{1}{2}$ " tools. He used the  $\frac{3}{4}$ " tools in the demo. Several members tried out the system and found out how easy it was to use the system. Terrence also said that he has a small shop and this does not take up much space when in use.

Thanks for the good demonstration.
