### Meeting

Don asked for volunteers to help with the instruction of the wood turning sections at the Hayesville High School. He needs someone to help with the second, third and fourth blocks on Thursdays and Fridays. There are approximately 12 to 15 students in the class and that is too many for

just one person. Any and all help will be appreciated. Also mentioned was the fact that Joe Waldroup (a BWG member) won not only the Crafts category of the Our State Magazine contest, but he also won the overall Grand Prize. Way to go Joe!

**Turning a Pepper Mill**



Alex started with a piece of Mahoney that was  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " X  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " X 5" or 6" long (the length can be whatever length you wish). He found the centers and on the top end, he made a  $1\frac{7}{8}$ " circle. He then set the grinder on the end that he had drawn the circle and marked where the screw holes were to be drilled. He drilled the four screw pilot holes. Next he rounded the stock to the size he wanted. He then drilled out the  $1\frac{7}{8}$ " hole so that the grinder could sit tightly in the hole. Then he drilled all the way through the piece with another Forstner bit that was smaller than  $1\frac{7}{8}$ ". He then made a bead and colored it with shoe polish. He then parted off the length he wanted and reversed it to clean up the bottom. He then put a mixture of mineral oil and beeswax on the project.

**Turning a Candle Holder**



Alex took a piece of poplar that was approximately 5" X 5" X 1" and jammed it between the chuck and tailstock and trued the top and put a crown on it. Next he reversed it and made a recess in the bottom. He then took it off the lathe and drilled a  $\frac{3}{4}$ " hole for the spindle. Next Alex took another piece of 5" X 5" stock and trued the face and turned the piece round. Then he made two grooves and burned with a wire. When finished, he drilled a  $\frac{3}{4}$ " hole for the spindle. Next was the spindle. He turned the piece round and

put a bead or two in and burned them with a wire. He then sized both ends to fit the 3/4" holes.

Thanks Alex for the great job.
